

How to Find Gold

Week 7

This is a suggested outline. Please use the planning in a way that suits you best.



Monday

- Daily exercise – Real Play/Joe Wicks/Run
- Read the story 'How to Find Gold' – talk about the events as they occur, were your predictions correct? Was the story as you imagined?
- Imagine you are going on an adventure to find gold. What would you need? What kind of character would you need to be? What dangers might you come across? Make a plan, 'How to Find Gold' and list your ideas using the questions given.

- Read to an adult for 20 minutes

Tuesday

- Daily exercise – Real Play/Joe Wicks/Run
- Explore and discuss the illustration in which Anna and Crocodile have created their large map. Where do you think they intend to go on their adventures? What makes you think that? Do their pictures remind you of anything you know in real life or stories? Where would you go on your adventures to find gold? Draw a map to help you find gold. Remember to put an 'X' on your map to show where the treasure is hidden!

- Read to an adult for 20 minutes

Wednesday

- Daily exercise – Real Play/Joe Wicks/Run
- Revisit the sea monster that Anna and Crocodile talk about. Thursday

- Daily exercise – Real Play/Joe Wicks/Run
- Look carefully at your sea monster. Write a fact file about it. What does it look like? Where does it live? What does it eat? (You could use the crocodile fact file from last week as an example.)
